Other Programming of Community importance during the 4th Quarter:

Hope for the Hungry. Asheville Radio Group Stations took part in a day-long fundraiser for Western Carolina Rescue Ministries on October 22, 2009. Sponsors and listeners contributed more than eight-thousand dollars, enough funds to purchase more than four-thousand meals for clients of the ministry.

WOXL-FM also contributed by airing more than 200 :90 second vignettes as well as in-studio interviews, live-breaks, promotional announcements, website presence and e-blasts. Asheville Radio Group contributed more than 57-thousand dollars in in-kind services to this effort.

Ken & Tammy's Christmas is for Kids (11/18 thru 12/22) on WOXL-FM. A month-long on-air "grass roots" campaign to give 100 needy kids a Christmas party, dinner, presents, and an overall joyous holiday experience. Air Personalities Ken Ulmer and Tammy Jones solicited listener support to provide gifts and other surprises for the children at a party on December 22nd. The Campaign included a minimum of 20 hours of work, including on-air mentions, Gathering and Transporting presents and other contributions.

WOXL-FM participation in the Asheville Holiday Parade. *Air staff and support staff handed out candy to parade viewers on November 21st.*

Seasonal Sizzle at Seven (December 5th, 12th, 19th). All ARG stations (including WOXL-FM) took part in a city-wide campaign to bring people to downtown Asheville during the month of December, including fireworks displays at 7 p.m. on the three Saturdays before Christmas. Investment given in on-air mentions, website, email blasts and other forms.

Traffic reports: WOXL-FM airs 5 traffic reports each weekday morning at 6:30, 7:00, 7:30, 8:00 and 8:30 a.m. Each report is :30 to :60 in length. There are five traffic reports each week day afternoon at 4:20, 4:40, 5:05, 5:20 and 5:35.

Winter Weather Coverage. WOXL-FM provided three-minute news updates on December 18th when a huge winter snowstorm hit Western North Carolina. There were a total of 20 updates on Friday afternoon (12/18) and continued into the following week as updates on power outages, traffic conditions and other pertinent information was given out. On-air commitment amounted to more than 5 hours of programming on the winter weather coverage.

Local News: WOXL-FM airs 3 minute Newscasts each weekday morning at 6:00, 6:30, 7:00, 7:30, 8:00 and 8:30.
